## ADJECTIVES DEGREES OF COMPARISON

### **Degrees of Comparison**

- It is possible to change the Degree of Comparison of an Adjective or Adverb in a sentence, without changing the meaning of the sentence.
- Comparison can be made using the three forms of the adjective.

Positive Comparative Superlative

## **Positive Degree**

The Positive Degree of an adjective in comparison is the adjective in its simple form. It is used to denote the mere existence of some quality of what we speak about. It is used when no comparison is made.



## **Comparative Degree**

The Comparative Degree denotes the existence of a higher degree of the quality than the positive. It is used when two things (or two sets of things) are compared.

Red apple is sweeter than green apple.





Gayan is taller than Geetha

## **Superlative Degree**

The Superlative Degree denotes the existence of the highest degree of the quality. It is used when more than two things are compared.



My brother is the tallest person in in our family.

The elephant is *the* largest of all land animals.

Note: We use THE before the superlative form of the adjective.

By adding 'er and 'est'

Short adjective + er/est. old  $\rightarrow$  older

young  $\rightarrow$  the youngest

Short adjective 'e' at the end. fine  $\rightarrow$  finer largre  $\rightarrow$  the largestest

### By using more and most

Long adjective: more/most + long adjective exciting  $\rightarrow$  more exciting beautiful  $\rightarrow$  the most beautiful
