- Mainly there are 4 types.
 - → Zero conditional (type zero)
 - → First conditional (type 1)
 - → Second conditional (type 2)
 - → Third conditional (type 3)
- Let's learn one by one.



Conditionals

ZERO CONDITIONAL



IF + Present Simple, Present Simple.




To talk about things that are always true, like a scientific fact



- If you freeze water, it turns into ice.
- And, if you heat water at 100 degrees, it boils.

First Conditional



- Examples If it rains, I will stay at home.
 - If I wake up late, I will miss the bus.



SECOND CONDITIONAL

IF+ Past Simple, Present Conditional

(To be: use WERE) (would/wouldn't + Verb (bare form)).



Structure

Imaginary situations in the present or future



• If I won a million dollars, I would buy a new car.

If I were you, I would quit smoking.

THIRD CONDITIONAL

IF + Past Perfect, Perfect Conditional

(Would/wouldn't + have + Past Participle)



Structure

Imaginary situations in the past



- If I had got a gold medal, I would have been happy.
- If I had met Susan last week, I would have given


If you do not arrive on time, we shall not keep the guests waiting for dinner.

IF-CLAUSE + SIMPLE PRESENT go /goes / don't go / doesn't go

MAIN CLAUSE + FUTURE SIMPLE will + infinitive

Example

If I studied harder, I would pass my exams. (But I don't do it - I'm just imagining this) If I were you, I would study more.


(Here we are giving some advice)

MAIN CLAUSE + CONDITIONAL would + infinitive
