We use 'this' and 'these' to talk about people/things that are near us.

• I like this pen.

• I want these pens.


We use 'that' and 'those' to talk about people/things that are far away.

- Do you like that picture on the wall?
- Do you like those pictures on the wall?

"This" is for something Singular and near "That" is for something singular and far "These" is for something plural and near "Those" is for something Plural and far

We use "is" with <u>this</u> and <u>that</u> We use " are" with <u>these</u> and <u>those</u>

Ex:




We call these words as **demonstratives** as well.
