## Adverbs

Adverbs modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs. They can add to or change the meaning of a word.

A great way to spot adverbs is to look for words that end in -ly.

## Adverbs Tell How It Happened

Briskly: Kristein briskly walked to the library, eager to complete her homework.
Brutally: It was brutally clear he was not interested in hearing my opinion.
Cheerfully: Anil cheerfully greeted Martin each morning.

## Adverbs Tell Where It Happened

Downstairs: The public library often holds meetings downstairs.
Everywhere: Jack looked everywhere for his missing keys.
Here: She will plant her garden here.

## Adverbs Tell When It Happened

Early: She arrived early for the meeting.
First: When I bake, I make cookies first.
Last: When I clean, I do laundry last.

## Adverbs Tell the Extent of the Action

Almost: I almost stopped at McDonald's for lunch, but I was running late.
Also: A talented singer, Jackson also enjoys playing the saxophone.
Enough: Daniel is finally tall enough to ride the roller coaster.
