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Plurals of Nouns

Let's study how singular nouns form their plurals



1. Most nouns form their plural form by adding -s to the singular form.

Singular (one)	Plural (more than one)
a dog	dogs
a boat	boats
a cat	cats
a song	songs
the shop	the shops
the tree	the trees
one teacher	two teachers
one book	five books

2. When a singular noun ends with **s**, **sh**, **ch** or **x**, its plural is formed by adding –**es**.



Singular (one)	Plural (more than one)
a bus	buses
a glass	glasses
a brush	brushes
a watch	watches

- Some singular nouns, ending with 'o' also takes –es when their plurals are formed.
 Singular (one) Plural (more than one) Mango mangoes Tomato tomatoes Potato potatoes Hero heroes

Exceptions :

radio	-	radios
studio	-	studios
piano	-	pianos
photo	-	photos

Regular -s plurals

We add-s to a noun to form the plural of many nouns.



Remember: Some nouns ending in o are different. a potato potatoes a tomato tomatoes
