An adverb describes the way an action is happening. Look at the following sentences.

1. Raj is dancing **happily** on the stage.

How is Raj dancing?

<u>happily.</u>

Let's learn some adverbs.



Adverbs are formed mainly from adjectives by adding – ly.

Adjective	Adverb
elegant	elegantly
kind	kindly
slow	slowly
bad	badly
sad	sadly
Lazy	Lazily
beautiful	beautifully
brave	bravely
safe	safely
brave	bravely
honest	honestly
greedy	greedily

- Sudeva walks fast.
 How does Sudeva walk?
 fast
- You will be charged for late payment She always comes late.
 late

fair	fair
far	far
free	free
high	high
like	like
likely	likely
live	live
long	long
low	low
right	right
wide	wide
