

FUTURE PERFECT TENSE

• Future perfect tense is used to tell about an action that will be completed at some point of the future.

Eg: We will have completed this book by the end of November.

• This tense is formed with,

Will have + past participle of the verb

- 1. He will have arrived by tomorrow evening.
- 2. They will have arrived at the same time.

Negatives:

Negatives are formed with,

Won't have + past participle of the verb

Eg: He won't have arrived by tomorrow evening.

They will not have arrived at the same time.

Questions:

In questions we use will before the subject.
Eg: Will he have arrived by tomorrow evening?
