Relative Pronoun

A *Relative Pronoun* is used to connect a clause or phrase to a noun or pronoun. We use them every day.

- With the most common relative pronouns being: who, whom, which and that.
- We use *'who, whom* and *whose'* for people.
- We use '*which*' for animals and things.
- We use *'that'* for people, animal or things.
- We use *'where'* to refer to places.
- The relative pronoun '*when*' is used to refer to the time.
 - Eg: 1. The girl <u>who</u> joined our class last week, is very clever.
 - 2. The girl **<u>whom</u>** I met at the party is a singer.
 - 3. I have a friend <u>whose</u> father is a magician.
 - 4. Noodles is a food <u>which</u> we eat every day.

 - 6. This is the place **where** my friend met with an accident.
