 - f) What does the clown say to himself? Do you think that he is happy?
- 3. Find **suitable quotations** to the following facts in the plot.
 - a) The clown is the cynosure (central attraction) of the audience.
 - b) The cynosure of the stage becomes merely a spectator at home.
 - c) In reality, he bears a great burden on his shoulders.
 - d) The dual personality of the clown.
 - e) The lack of mutual understanding between the wife and the clown.
 - f) The desire of the clown to play his true role at home without being a clown.
