

### Competency Level-5.4: Reads and responds to simple poems

Some literary techniques we can find in poems and other literary texts can be stated as follows;

\*<u>Visual imagery</u>- Writer appeals to the reader's sense of sight; pictures can be visualized through the writer's words.

Eg:-colour /size (golden sun)

\*<u>Auditory imagery</u>- Writer appeals to the reader's sense of sound; sound can be heard through the writer's words.

Eg:-(buzzing bees)

\*Metaphor- Two completely different aspects are compared.

Eg:- **He** is a **lion**.

\*Simile - Two completely different aspects are compared with the words 'like' or 'as'.

Eg:- He is <u>like</u> a lion.

\*Rhyming words - brain: train
