
Reciprocal pronouns → 'Each other' and 'One another'

- * We use 'each other' and 'one another' to show that each person in a group of two or more people does/do something to the others.
- * There is a little difference in the meaning between 'each other' and 'one another' where 'each other' is used to talk about two people or two things and 'one another' is used to talk about more than two.
- Ex:- 1) Kasun and Ravindu helped each other.

(Kasun helped Ravindu and Ravindu helped Kasun.)

2) Senali, Hashini and Imasha are going to meet one another at the park.

(Senali, Hashini and Imasha are going to meet themselves.)
