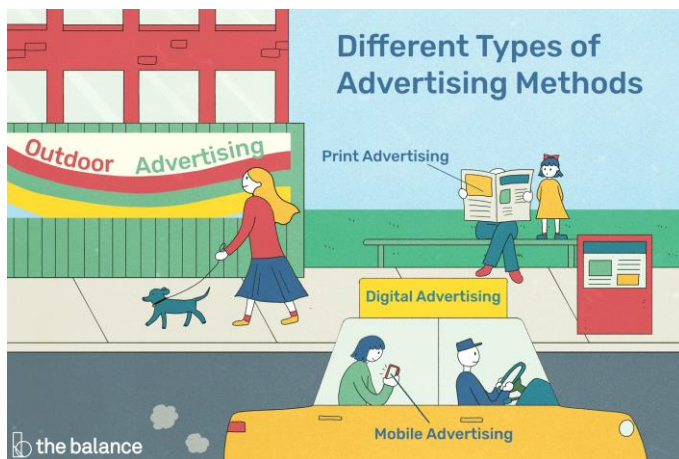

The Great Wall of China is an ancient series of walls and fortifications, totaling more than 13,000 miles in length, located in northern China. Perhaps the most recognizable symbol of China and its long and vivid history, the Great Wall was originally conceived by Emperor Qin Shi Huang in the third century B.C. as a means of preventing incursions from barbarian nomads. The best-known and best-preserved section of the Great Wall was built in the 14th through 17th centuries A.D., during the Ming dynasty. Though the Great Wall never effectively prevented invaders from entering China, it came to function as a powerful symbol of Chinese civilization's enduring strength.

Applications are invited from qualified Sri Lankan citizens for the following vacancies in Mahaweli Authority of Sri Lanka.

Posts : Engineer (Electrical)
Service Group : Manager (MM 1-1 service group)
Salary Scale : Rs. 53,175 - 10 x 1,375 - 15 x 1,910 = 95,575/= at the time of calling applications (as per Management Services Department Circular No. 02/2016)
Basic Salary: Rs. 47,668/=

Qualifications (1 or 2 below)

1. Bachelor of Science degree relevant to the post recognized by the University Grants Commission and the Institute of Engineers of Sri Lanka.
2. Should have obtained educational qualifications equivalent to the degree course recognized by the University Grants Commission and the Institute of Engineers of Sri Lanka.

Age : Should not be less than 22 years and not more than 45 years.

Method of Recruitment : Through a written competitive exam and a structured interviews.

A self prepared application with bio data should be sent to reach the Director General, Mahaweli Authority of Sri Lanka, No. 500, T.B. Jayah Mawatha, Colombo 10, on or before 01.02.2019 by registered post.
