

### **Das Perfekt (Present Perfect)**

We are finally going to learn to talk about past events in German Language. You are about to learn what is called “Present Perfect” tense in English or “ das Perfekt” in German. But don’t be confused by the word “present” here. This is a past tense that talks about past events. It’s the English terminology that is confusing. Although there are two different past tenses in German, as in English, the “ Perfkt” that you are learning is used most often in spoken German.

We use two helping verbs in German Language to make “Perfekt”.

† **haben ( to have)**

† **sein (to be)**
