

Last week we learnt how to form sentences using the three helping verbs (Primary verbs) am, is and are. And today we are going to learn how to form questions with am, is and are. Interrogative sentences are questions. We use questions when asking for information. The answers for these questions will always be 'Yes' or 'No'

Look at the following examples.

Are you Raj?



Yes, I am Raj.



Are you friends?



Yes, we are friends.





Yes, he is a boy.













Yes, They are happy.





Yes, it is a pencil
