



## Comparatives and superlatives

Adjectives are also used for indicating the position on a scale of comparison. They are comparative form, and the superlative form.

### Comparative form

When two objects or persons are being compared, the comparative form of the adjective is used. The comparative adjective can be formed in two ways.

- Adding –er to the positive form of the adjective.

**(I am taller than my brother.)**

- Adding the word more before the adjective.

**(Hulk is more powerful than Spiderman.)**

### Superlative form

The superlative is used to say what thing or person has the most of a particular quality within a group or of its kind. The superlative can be formed in two ways:

- Adding –est to the Positive form of the adjective.

**(I am the tallest in my family.)**

- Adding the word most before the adjective.

**(Hulk is the most powerful cartoon character I have ever seen.)**
