A large, impressive house.
A large building, fortified against attack with thick walls, battlements, towers and
often a moat.
An apartment / is a self-contained housing unit only part of a building, generally
on a single level.
A dome-shaped Eskimo house, typically built from blocks of solid snow.
A house with a roof covering of straw, reeds, palm leaves or a similar material.
