Simple Present Tense

Present Simple Tense

Both terms can be used to identify this tense.

Read the text given below paying your attention to the words in bold.

Anitha **is** a teacher. She **is** a teacher of English. She **goes** to school every morning and **teaches** her students. All the students **like** her very much. But today she is staying at home. She has not gone to school today.

Notice the words in bold in the text. They all are in the Simple Present Tense.

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is

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I / we / you / they go / teach / write / run etc.

He / she / it goes / teaches / writes / runs etc.

am With personal pronoun "I"

is With singular nouns

are With plural nouns
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- We use the Simple Present Tense to talk about things in general.
- We are not thinking only about now.
- > We use it to say that something happens all the time or repeatedly or something is true in general.
- It is not important whether the action is happening at the time of speaking.

Examples

- I am a good student in our class.
- I am hungry now.
- She is a pretty lady.
- Mala is from a wealthy family.
- His name is Nimal and he is my friend.
- We are doctors and we are talented.
- They are very poor people.
- Cats are innocent animals.

- Nurses look after patients in hospitals.
- I usually go away at weekends.
- Children play cricket in the evening.
- They catch fish to earn money.
- The earth goes round the sun.
- She works in a bank.
- My brother drives a car.
- Sheela makes tasty food items.

- The baby often cries when his mother is not around.
- We seldom go out to play as we have a lot to do.
- I sometimes feel alone though I have everything in my life.

Question Form

We use **Do / Does** to make questions.

Do - With plural nouns

Does - With singular nouns

She cleans her room daily.

Does she **clean** her room daily?

You drink lots of water.

Do you drink lots of water?

Do	I / we / you / they	work? come? do? eat?
Does	he / she / it	run? study?

Make questions. Do not forget to put question marks at the end.

- Why does Beth always complain about the food? Beth always complains about the food because they are too spicy.
- Why don't you go on a vacation? I don't go on a vacation because I am busy with my work.
- Which dress does Mala like? Mala likes the blue one.

Negative Form

We use **Do not / Does not** to make negative form.

Do not - Don't

Does not - Doesn't

She cleans her room daily.

She does not clean her room daily.

You drink lots of water.

You **do not drink** lots of water.

I / we / you / they	do not	work come do eat run
he / she / it	does not	study
